C. Chief Instructor's Report

Annual RYA Inspection

This took place during Week 3 of our Summer Cruise at Oulton Broad.

Once again, I am delighted to report that our Inspector, Sue Head found our club to be, "All Compliant", which means that as a Training Centre, we fully meet all that the RYA requires of us. This is our sixth "All Compliant" inspection report.

Sue spoke to the whole cruise participants, and said that,

"We have an excellent club which not only teaches sailing skills but also 'Broadsmanship'.", which is something very close to our hearts in the GWYC. She said that all of the paperwork was in very good order and she was impressed by the quality of teaching.

A considerable amount of work goes into preparing for the Annual Inspection and once again, I would like to thank Rosemary for spending an incredible amount of time preparing all the paperwork and documentation in the weeks prior to our Summer Cruise. Our Commodore and RYA Principal, Andy Garnham, once again took a leading role on the day of the Inspection by meeting with Sue and along with Rosemary and myself, answering the many searching questions about how the club runs. Finally, my thanks to all of those who sailed on Week 3 for helping to make our club such a success.

Annual Senior Personnel Training Weekend

This took place at Cantley, over the weekend of the 22nd/23rd June. This year the focus was for Skippers, First Mates and Mates, Instructors and Senior Instructors; in other words, all of those who have positions of responsibility during our Club Cruises. Sixteen people participated, involving nearly all of the skippers, mates, etc sailing on this year's Summer Cruise.

We included a whole range of both sailing and shore based activities: Safety, Safeguarding, GW Ranks and RYA levels, the role of the mate, passage planning and use of tide tables and practical sessions on how to prepare a yacht for sailing, moorings and departures, points of sailing and man overboard procedure were just some of the areas covered. I would like to thank Andy and Nick Vowles for their support and also John Duff and Mark Wells for leading two of the sessions

My thanks to all those who came. This is a key aspect of our training, so Andy and I would encourage all relevant members to participate in future events if you can.

RYA Progression

Although there is no formal requirement for those who sail with the Green Wyvern to acquire sailing qualifications, almost all avail themselves of the opportunity to do so. This is much appreciated by the Club as we are going to need Instructors and Senior Instructors for the Club to continue to flourish.

During the 2019 season:

5 people achieved Level 1, Start Sailing; 4 people achieved Level 2, Basic Skills;



1 people achieved Level 3, Better Sailing:

1, people achieved the Seamanship qualification;

- 2 people achieved the Day Sailing qualification; and
- 2 people became Assistant Instructors.

The above figures reflect our discussions in committee meetings and the training weekend, of the need to ensure that people following the RYA Keelboat scheme are fully competent before moving to the next level.

Just in the same way, as there is no need to push people through the GWYC ranks, there is no need to push them through RYA levels either. Some of the youngsters, in their feedback forms from the 2018 season commented that they felt 'a little rushed' and we have tried to ensure that this does not happen. Nick Vowles, who was SI in week 2 wrote a thorough and very helpful report reflecting some of these issues and a suggested route forward and I agree with the points that he raised.

Finally, I would like to offer my sincere thanks to all those Senior Instructors, Instructors and Assistant Instructors who have participated in Club Weeks and given so much time, energy and enthusiasm (and good humour) to introducing so many people to sailing with The Green Wyvern.

D. Treasurer's Report

Despite having fewer club week bookings this year, the financial position of the club remains healthy, despite cruise fees remaining at the same level. There was also no instructor training which means the training fund is carrying over a much greater sum than last year. With the introduction of Rebecca to the fleet there has been no need for commercial hire, which is also a positive factor. The PAN/LJB fund was only used once this year, and has continued to grow due to generous donations from club members and other fund raising activities. Given the state of the finances, I am recommending to the AGM that boat owners payments rise from £385 to £400 per boat week. I should just remind members that the Training and PAN/LJB money is kept in a separate bank account, these are also separate from each other. in my own accounting and are shown as such in this report.

The ranks remained the same however it was noted that we should have encouraged the crew to gain more experience on the foredeck to advance in sailing skills. Noted for next year to mix up crew dynamics to perhaps facilitate this.

Summer Cruise 2019: 27th July – 16th August – Cantley to Somerleyton

We decided to cut the cruise to three weeks this year due to low bookings for week one. In the beginning it might have filled up to be able to run a couple of boats however with conflicts in school holidays and limited skipper and mate availability we decided it was better to have three full weeks. There was much back and forth on which week we were actually sailing on; I've kept the cancelled week one in the report. The weeks were well balanced with five boats weeks two and three and six boats week four. We had two 'new' skippers (but not new Wyverners – Emma Duff and Mel Farrar) on the cruise who kept us from having to turn down sailors as some of our 'regular' skippers could not sail this year due to other commitments. The younger folks did a great deal of recruiting for us bringing their friends who we hope to see again.

Week One: Cancelled

<u>Week Two:</u> Five boats with 19 sailors. Of these there were three first timers and three second timers. It was great to be able to put together three boats with skipper and mate combinations of under aged 30. On that note the commodore realised he was the oldest member of the fleet for the first time. The ebb and flow of the tides of life. ⁽²⁾ The cruise went through Yarmouth on the 1st day – 6 bridges – wow. The weather kept the boats stormbound at Hunters Yard for a day and a half but was made up for by having the BBQ and showers. It was also the maiden club cruise for Rebecca.

<u>Week Three:</u> Five boats again with 20 sailors and Force Four and Leda joining In Company. Headed from Wroxham to Beccles so back through Yarmouth - tacking across Breydon was fantastic. High water entry to Yarmouth moorings and showers. Most boats going for Fish and Chips and mine was yummy but highlight food was veggie pizza's cooked by the girls. We tried to set a record for how many boats we could get through Breydon Bridge at the same time; I think we did it $(3 \frac{1}{2})$? The inspection was this week at Oulton – lovely day and we passed again with flying colours. Did John Fitch ever find his glasses?

<u>Week Four:</u> Six boats with 23 sailors with Sparklet joining the cruise. The cruise started at Beccles Amateur Sailing Club – thanks to the club for offering the moorings as the Yacht Club as full with a Wooden Broads Cruiser Show – some lovely old boats that we met on the weeks of the cruise. The weather made the meet and greet with the parents quite a challenge in the gale force winds and the cruise was storm bound until Monday morning. Fantastic BBQ at Pottles Barn with an array of non-sailing Wyverners joining us and helping out the mates – thanks Maggie, Jan, Kerry. We had the fire pit going and games in the house. Lisa worried that Pierce has surpassed her burger making skills (but hey we pass the torch) and OMG – Kerry's tiramisu to die for. Reminder to commodore to be more explicit when



asking crew to let go of jib sheets and to hold ends however jib sheets skilfully saved by the prop and chance for nature swim by mate in Barton.

Feedback Summary:

From Sailors: This is my general take of the feedback and some comments but proposing perhaps I submit numbers by week/question next year...let me know if necessary.

Most Excellent to Very Good however we received one Poor on Welcome week four due to Sparklet not be ready to inhabit but given the weather rigging was impossible but then it should have been done already. There was a general feeling the Welcomes need improvement as to what is happening, where we are going, what is expected of the crew however most comments Very Good to Good. Also with everything that needs to happen the first day it would be good to have a dedicated Welcome person who can stay at the moorings and greet the kids and parents (Sailing Secretary – spends too much time running other errands). Perhaps we ask Mates to come early if possible.

Based on feedback of information received about your sailing week, I think sending out dietary requirements earlier – my bad. We can add more information in the Crew Pack about how the week works along with sending the GWYC Sailing Basics Booklet we are writing.

There were comments on leaky boats and more shower stops (week 4). Overall the food was given praise but a few comments on food quality and quantity. Lisa is getting with Mates to create a Mates Checklist and Advice.

The BBQs were successful as usual and getting to make new friends were highlighted. Again there were requests to sail on other boats, spend more time with others and being able to explore the areas where we stopped.

I get the impression more time perfecting sailing skills like man overboard, moorings would be appreciated. All enjoyed learning the reefing and the sailing.

Running the Cruises: This is just my take on a few things. Other feedback welcome.

Where we excel:

- I think we have gotten really good at BBQs my passion of course.
- Recruitment by the youngsters
- Flexibility and going the extra nautical mile to make the cruise happen

Where we can improve:

- Assessing and reporting damages to the boat owner in a more timely manner
- Checking boats when crew is leaving for personal items we had more than normal items left behind and at this point no claimants.
- Having boats ready for sailing. I know the boat owners work very hard on this and sometimes circumstances cannot be help. As Sailing Secretary I can work on getting realistic assessments and make alternative plans. I think we learned from this year.

G. Welfare Officer's Report



As this is the first year that we have officially had a Club Welfare Officer (CWO), I think that it would be useful to give the Welfare Officer's main role and responsibilities.

The Club Welfare Officer's main roles are to:

- 1. ensure that the club has up to date procedures, that volunteers are aware of and that everyone follows good practice;
- 2. be the first point of contact for any concerns, seeking advice and support from the RYA as necessary;
- 3. be the first point of contact for volunteers, parents and children/young people where concerns about children's welfare, poor practice or child abuse;
- 4. be responsible for following the RYA/RYA Child Welfare policy and procedures, in particular the reporting procedures;
- 5. report the concerns to the RYA and be the first point of contact with the RYA/RYA Child Welfare Lead Officers;
- 6. promote the clubs best practice guidance/code of conduct within the club; and
- 7. to be 'visible' at the club and both parents and sailors should know who the CWO is and how to contact them.

The Club Welfare Officer has responsibility for DBS checks of volunteers.

As CWO, I can report that we have welfare policies and procedures in place that are based on RYA guidelines and that they have been adapted to reflect the needs of the GWYC.

All necessary DBS checks were up to date for the 2019 sailing season.

We have had two Welfare issues this year which the Commodore, Chief Instructor and Club Welfare Officer dealt with. One was an inquiry to the RYA as to whether the GWYC had a Child Protection Policy as it was not on the website. Our reply to this was that the policy was on the members' area of the website but was available on request to any parent, prospective parent or interested party on request. The second was a student issue which was resolved with the Commodore, Chief Instructor, Sailing Secretary, the relevant skipper and parents.

Finally, my thanks to all of the club officers, skippers, first mates and mates who are the eyes and ears of the high level of welfare that the GWYC expects and to remind everyone that it is the whole club's responsibility to ensure children's welfare and everyone has a role to play.



Mark Thorne proposed (and Jonathan Winterton seconded) that all the above reports be accepted. The proposal was agreed unanimously.

6. Motions

Motion 1

Proposed by Mark Thorne, Seconded by Lisa Reed

(Second changed from Andy Garnham as he wants to remain neutral)*

'Invitation to receive membership should normally be considered at the end of a weeks sailing.'

This would require the relevant section of Operating Procedures below to be modified:

'Those invited to become members (usually after two week's cruising) should be capable of passing RYA level two.'

And Club Rule 7.2 to be modified

'First and Second Timers shall be associate members of the club for the full calendar year (s) in which they cruise.'

Items above and other relevant parts of club manual would need to be edited accordingly.

M Thorne introduced his motion with some preamble/ background, in which the following points were made:

- It was suggested that 'two weeks' (as pertaining to being invited to membership) is an historical anomaly;
- We now know most of the people who are invited prior to them joining their first Club week;
- It seems churlish to keep 1st timers on probation after 'a great week';
- But equally, it shouldn't be automatic, and if doubt, do not offer it;
- That there is a need to distinguish between 'member' and 'crew member' as a consequence of the above, that the current rules do not.

Jonathan Winterton replied:-

He passed around a paper summarising the Club ranks, together with a rather older extract (from 1980's) giving a ratings system for 1st Timers (A* to C), and the necessary skills to be found in Members.

- There is currently no mechanism for a person to be made 'just a member' except 'in exceptional circumstances';
- Agrees that the current rules need tightening up as they are open to interpretation;
- Sees no requirement to change the current system, but happy to 'go along with it' if the meeting so decides;
- Also made the point that in such a case it would be necessary to distinguish between 'member' and 'crew member'.

Lisa Reed (for the motion): This motion, if carried, would clarify the issue of membership vs. crew. Has a problem with consistency of application of the current rules across different weeks, and the effect on



young people's well-being that this can occasion. Suggests removing the concept of 'membership' from the ranking system.

Melanie Farrar (against the motion): The Committee is currently considering how to widen the membership, possibly to include young carer's who would not be known to us – could we elect 4/5 of a week to membership and not the other? (Implicitly 'No'). Also, there are those we definitely want to see again – the 'exceptionals' – but the current rules allow for this. This whole area needs looking at in detail: the GWYC is all about 'sailing the two weeks' – we shouldn't need to change this. Membership is for life, and a privilege. We shouldn't change it.

The discussion was then opened to the floor:-

Melina Burwood: young people will care if they feel that they are being 'left out'. Therefore, leave as is.

Rosemary Winterton: it is good to have something to give a young person after 2 weeks sailing, rather than piling it all on after the first week. Also good to have two skipper's opinions of the person; to evaluate their characters and suitability for 'Wyvernship'.

Denis Kilner – values the flexibility of the current system; Melanie Farrar – consistency is a must. We need to support the Commodore (of the week) in making those decisions, and some guidelines are required.

Mark Thorne – I am definitely not saying that we should invite all comers after one week irrespective. However, does want to split membership from crew ranks. We should make the rules reflect the vast majority of our experience.

Will Learoyd – has a problem with the word 'exceptional' (in so far as it is not defined), but agrees with the proposed separation of membership and crew ranks.

Michael Burwood – clarified that the current rules require the Committee to ratify invitations to membership.

Margaret Kilner – agrees with the point made by Melanie Farrar that if people are keen enough they will come back anyway – being gifted membership is unlikely to make any difference.

Rosemary Winterton – 'two weeks' are valuable. Membership after a week is not a driver for kids; worried that creating membership after just one week would create an 'uneven playing field' that may negatively affect the self esteem of those not chosen.

Melanie Farrar – remember that we are dealing with young people, who are developing all the time and need time to adjust to what we do and the challenges they face.

Simon Miles – there are merits on both sides of the argument. What appears to be agreed upon is that we need to go away and do some work in the background to develop guidelines as to what should happen currently. The rules need tightening and made consistent.



Jonathan Winterton (summing up):- If 'members' made after 1 week we are saying 'nice person, join our world'. However, this would be in conflict with the first bit of the Operations Procedures which states that the principal activity of the GWYC is 'the organisation of sailing holidays...etc, etc' and therefore we cannot disassociate sailing ability from membership/personal development. We are a club of people, who also teach people to sail. Still keen on maintaining the ethos of GWYC.

On the point of consistency – is glad of the flexibility in the current system; however, all should apply it equally. We need a clear set of rules, and will need a clear steer from this meeting as to which route we take (1 week or 2).

Mark Thorne:- we must distinguish between 'member' and 'ranks'. Consistency is key – whatever the age of the person. It has been close to automatic for 1^{st} timers over the age of 18 to be offered membership in recent past.

Andrew Garnham:- we have had a passionate debate over the last 40 minutes. There are strong views on both sides, but it is very important that young people feel treated fairly.

The motion was put to the vote: In favour: 5 Against: 7 Abstentions: 1

The motion falls.

Motion 2

Proposed by Jonathan Winterton, Seconded by Melanie Farrow

Mark Thorne's motion requests that all First Timers become GWYC members at the end of the first week. We need to clarify that being a Club Member does not imply that everyone is ready to be a crew member at the same time, i.e. we must separate the idea of membership and rank.

So we have an either/or motion:

Either, If the AGM votes for Club membership after one week, the motion is:

'Under 18 sailors shall be invited to become a GWYC member at the end of their first week of sailing. If they return to sail for a second week, they will be classed as a Second Timer. Under 18 sailors shall also be classed as 'Sailing Beginners' for their first two weeks. Those that have then sailed two weeks shall be given the rank of crew at the completion of their second week'

The Club Rules and Procedures shall be changed to clarify this.

'Or, If the AGM decide that they wish to maintain the status quo and make all under 18 sailors members of the GWYC at the end of the second week, the motion is:

Under 18 sailors shall be invited to become a GWYC crew member at the end of the second week. Only adult sailors, ie those over 18, may be considered for Club Membership after one week.'

The Club Rules and Procedures will be changed to clarify this.



The second part (which comes into effect on the fall of the first motion) has already been debated. It was agreed that the motion be withdrawn.

Rosemary Winterton – to expand on Simon's point above, proposes the setting up of a sub-committee to review the situation, to send the findings to the membership for comment, re-review in light of any comments and to bring to the AGM (or an EGM).

Lisa Reed – it would be wrong to vote on the motion; we need the sub-committee to consider the arguments.

Jonathan Winterton withdrew his motion, and therefore the status quo prevails. However, can the working group report and have its' recommendations in place in time for Summer 2020? Suggested that an Extraordinary General Meeting be held at the Rigging Party. Motion carried unanimously.

7. Cruise Fees and Food Money for 2019.

The cruise fees should remain the same as this year at £160 for early booking and £180 for those booking after one month before sailing, and food money should also stay as is (Thought to be £35, but actually increased to £40 at AGM 2018).

Carried by acclamation.
